Rome, Nov. 27.—Dr. Karp, French Consul at Rome, and Dr. G. G. M. A. of the Consulate, have been released to the Capuchins.

Valparaiso, Nov. 27.—The principal meeting between Chile and Peru was withdrawn yesterday by the two countries' governments. The disagreement was in reference to the appointment of an arbitrator for the settlement of claims, but it is thought an agreement will soon be reached.

Exmouth, Va., Nov. 27.—President-Elect Cleveland arose at 3:30 this morning and took a walk about the afterward became fatigued and remained in bed until noon. About 2 o'clock he took his usual drive along the creek. After their return the regular 5 o'clock dinner was served and the evening was spent quietly.

Carrboro, Nov. 27.—A minister at the capital today told a correspondent that General Creighton would substitute fully the individual right of self-government over the right to arrest criminals on merchandise in her waters. This right will be more particularly insisted upon when the fugitives are citizens of Venezuela.

Paris, Nov. 27.—It is telegraphed here on good authority that Baron Hirsch's flight had been successful through the assistance of the branch of a party which he was shooting. According to the latest report it seems that the accident was only a bad burn and will be all right after a few days rest.

Banta City, Cal., Nov. 27.—The heavier storms of wind and rain for many years are prevailing. The electric wires are down in the city and the oil wells are being obscured rock and sand and some distance away to see. They were supposed to be from a large vessel in distress. There are no signs of life-saving service here, and no response could be made to the signal.

#### SCHOOL QUARANTINED

On Account of the Death of a Child  
in the Building from Yellow  
Fever.

There was no school in the Hooper school building in the Nineteenth Ward today and there will be none until further notice. The cause of the suspension is the death from yellow fever of a child of Janitor Baldwin who occupies a portion of the building as a residence. The victim was a bright lad about two years of age. He had been sick about four weeks. Dr. Charles E. Dickey says there was a case of scarlet fever near the school some time ago and believes that the germs of the disease were not all killed and that the deceased contracted the fever by coming in contact with them.

A yellow flag has been placed on the building which will be strictly quarantined until such time as it shall have been thoroughly disinfected.

Shot at Eureka.

AL. Collins, a Holliston-Beek miner who engaged in a saloon quarrel with a prospector at Korea, a few nights ago, has been brought to this city with two pistol shot wounds in his left thigh, for treatment. He is now in the hospital and is expected to make a full recovery and rest he will be all right again.

Collins' antagonist was a man named Parker, who was arrested by the officers immediately after the shooting. The affair was the result of an election bet.
