SHEEP AND WOOL.

Fatten and market the old sheep; keep those that are full of vigor. The quality of our sheep is more to us than the number we possess.

Sleep ought not to be compelled to eat dirty food or drink foul water. Sheep eat so many different kinds of plants that cattle and horses leave that they really increase the product of the pasture.

If desired to mark the sheep after shearing until there is two or three weeks' difference in shearing, the marks will stay on better.

Feeding in sheep husbandry is like any other problem in live stock. Good care and feeding are necessary or the flock will degenerate.

No branch of farming shows better returns for money invested, and labor expended, than that of sheep raising. It is run on systematic business principles.

Those unfamiliar with rape can best gain an idea of how it looks and what sort of a feeding substance it is by remembering that forage rape resembles a rutabaga turnip root to least instead of forming an enlarged root stalk.

The Romans adopted the plan of running their flocks over the wheat fields, their object being to allow them to eat the blades close to the ground to prevent excessive weight of straw and the "lodging" of the crop.

Two machines have recently been invented which are intended to scare wolves from the range flocks during the lambing season. One is fitted with revolving colored lights and when wound up will shoot colored light in rapid intervals. The other is an automatic gun which is intended to be fired every fifteen minutes.

It is impossible to advise which is the best sheep for mutton and wool, for the reason that the locality, the kind of food, and the character of the owner, all enter into the choice of sheep for wool or mutton. It is a matter of taste and disposition on the part of the shepherd, for what one loves the most he will be the most successful with.
