**EVENTS IN THE WEST.**

**A Record of Occurrences in Neighboring States and Territories.**

**SEALING CATCH LIGHT THIS SEASON.**  
 Mark Citizens Not Heard From—Accused Her Relative—Killed in Hunting—Arrested—Murderer.

The call issued by Chairman Peters for a conference of Silver Republicans in Idaho, Idaho, Feb. 25, has been responded to, as well as a meeting of the state committee March 1st.

The acting secretary of war says that of the western states, only Nevada has the number of men stated. Utah, 25,000, has the most.

D. Hunter of Morgan, Utah, in the course of a luncheon letter to the Omaha Standard says there are not a great many cattle in those parts, but to say so is to know they are mostly feeding and fattening.

The bird was flying over a duck boat in which a loaded shotgun was fixed on to the level. The gun was discharged, the full charge striking the body.

Charles Collins, a carpenter, was found dead in the sand-dunes at the end of the X of the Pacific railroad, Thursday, of every morning. A search on the bank of his dead body showed that he had been shot. It was known to some extent that he was shot. A Mexican named Pedro Garcia is in Salt Lake with the crime.

Mrs. David Fisher and F. W. Nitzberg returned Friday from a visit to the coast. They were in the city of San Francisco. While in the latter city they conferred with the secretary of the Commercial association in regard to business in connection with the Alaskan coast. The work of connecting the coast with the city of San Francisco, etc., will be pushed forward rapidly now. In order that advantage may be taken of the best season.

A special train is at present speeding across the coast from the East. The train is equipped with passenger coaches, sleeping and dining cars, and will arrive at Salt Lake on Tuesday evening.

James L. Dicks of Tremble station, near Natick, Ore., while on a hunting party Saturday last, was shot and killed by a bullet from a rifle. The bullet entered his chest and passed through his lungs, and he died in a few minutes. The bullet was found in his chest.

Mr. Marshall is on his way to London in connection with the syndicate of which he is a director.

The sealing fish this season is very small and the catch is not encouraging. Captain O'Leary of the schooner Geneva reports that seals are very scarce and wild and the weather very unsuitable for sealing. Captain A. Norman of the schooner Blue Taylor lost seven of his men by diphtheria and had to put into port for repairs. He also says that few seals are to be found and people a light catch. It is stated that the Cox and Martin sealing fleet of Victoria, B. C., will be put in commission this year, although sailors and hunters had been engaged. It is not known whether the precautions taken by the United States to prevent contagious fever had anything to do with the extension of the West of British seals.

The Southern Pacific company has placed a contract for the new cable car that is to span the Oakland, Cal., straits. A year or more ago the cable department decided that the bridge over Oakland creek at Webster street, Alameda, was not sufficient to carry the cable cars and service on the Southern Pacific company and its subsidiaries. Alameda reports that the cable spanning the straits would have to be widened to 120 feet on both sides of the central pier. The opening of the existing bridge is eighty feet wide. This was equivalent to a notification that the existing bridge would have to be removed.
