

BOUNDARIES OF VOTING DISTRICTS

Reduced From Fifty-three to Forty-one by County Clerk.

PERMITS USE OF MACHINES.

Complete List Showing Citizens Location of Places in Each Ward Where Ballots May be Cast.

County Clerk Eldredge has completed the work of describing the boundaries of the 41 voting districts of the city as decided upon by the county commissioners after a consultation with the chairman of the three political parties on Wednesday. The voting districts were reduced from 53 to 41 so as to permit of the use of the new voting machines in the election this fall. Following are the boundaries of the districts:

FIRST WARD.

DISTRICT NO. 3.
Commencing at the intersection of East street and Eighth South street and running thence south along the east side of State street to the intersection of State street and Ninth South street; thence east along the north side of Ninth South street to the intersection of Ninth South street and Eleventh East street; thence south along the east side of Eleventh East street to the intersection of Eleventh East street and Ninth South street; thence south along the east side of Ninth South street to the place of beginning.

DISTRICT NO. 4.
Commencing at the intersection of East street and Seventh South street and running thence south along the east side of State street to the intersection of State street and Eighth South street; thence east along the north side of Eighth South street to the intersection of Eighth South street and Eleventh East street; thence south along the east side of Eleventh East street to the intersection of Eleventh East street and Eighth South street; thence south along the east side of Eighth South street to the place of beginning.

DISTRICT NO. 5.
All of that territory lying between the south side of Sixth South street and the north side of Tenth South street and between the east side of East Temple street and the west side of Second East street.

DISTRICT NO. 6.
All of that territory lying between the south side of Sixth South street and the north side of Tenth South street and between the east side of East Temple street and the west side of Second East street.

DISTRICT NO. 7.
All of that territory lying between the south side of Third South street and the north side of Sixth South street and between the east side of East Temple street and the west side of Second East street.

DISTRICT NO. 8.
All of that territory lying between the south side of Third South street and the north side of Sixth South street and between the east side of East Temple street and the west side of Second East street.

DISTRICT NO. 9.
All of that territory lying between the south side of Third South street and the north side of Sixth South street and between the east side of East Temple street and the west side of Second East street.

DISTRICT NO. 10.

MAJOR BIRD DEAD.

Well Known Attorney of This City Victim of Heart Failure.

Maj. William H. Bird, the well known Salt Lake City lawyer and an old resident of this city, died of heart failure last night, after suffering from trouble with his heart since last summer. He leaves a wife and eight children. Maj. Bird was born in Delaware, 1840, and served with distinction through the Civil war, being at one time stationed as an army officer at Fort Douglas. He came west when the Union Pacific was building through Wyoming, and had charge of construction until Larimer was reached. After that he came to Salt Lake and practiced law. He formed the well known firm of Bird & Lowe, which was dissolved 15 years ago by the death of Mr. Lowe. Maj. Bird was connected with legal departments of the Southern Pacific, Oregon Short Line and Rio Grande Railway companies, and for some time prior to his illness was in the service of the Utah Fuel company. The family were all at his bedside when he died. The children are Frank A. Bird, Sherwood, Harold, Scott E., William C., Fanny C., Bird, Laura B. Bird, and Grace. Arrangements for the funeral are being made.
