An axle for vehicles has been patent-
ed by Mr. Gouverneur M. Forbes, of
Salt Lake City, Utah Territory. It
has crank arms at its ends, with cams
for retaining the body level or nearly
so as the crank turns over, the design
being to make the vehicle travel more
easily and smoothly than one with a
straight axle over ordinary roads.—

SHERIFF BELNAP, of Weber County,
brought down from Ogden yesterday,
to turn over to the custody of the U. S.
marshal, John Hays, charged with an
attempt at rape and bound over on
the 6th inst. before Justice Dec, to
await the action of the grand jury,
pending which he will be consigned to
the penitentiary.
This afternoon a case was called for
trial in the Third District Court.
Major Hoffman arose and stated that
General Maxwell, one of the counsel in
the case, was not able to appear in be-
half of his client. The Court and at-
torneys smiled, and His Honor re-
marked, "I know that General Max-
well is not in the case, but I am ap-
pearing in the afternoon, from observation."
The "General" had been taken down
stairs, drunk, a short time before.

LOCAL NEWS.

Three Years in the Pen.—Joseph
Raymond, who stole W. O. Sawyer's
horse and wagon last September, was
tried in the Third District Court this
morning. The jury brought in a ver-
dict of guilty, and Raymond was sen-
tenced to three years' imprisonment in
the penitentiary.
Divorce Granted.—In the District
Court this morning, Mr. McKay, at-
torney for Mary Swain, in her applica-
tion for divorce against Robert Swain,
called the attention of the Court to the
fact that service of summons had been
made on the defendant October 2, and
that no answer had been filed within
the allotted time, ten days. The Court
ordered that judgment be given by de-
fault, and that the decree of divorce be
granted.

The "Copper" Act.—Yesterday an
application was made in the Third
District Court for the release from the
Penitentiary of Oliver Acord, who was
sentenced to five years' imprisonment
in May, 1892, for robbing the mail.
His attorneys claimed that he was en-
titled to ten days' deduction from each
month of his term, under the copper
act, which time, if granted would set
him at liberty. Mr. Varian, for the
government, argued that Acord was
only entitled to five days for the first
full year, seven for the second, nine
for the third, and ten for each subse-
quent year. The Court took the
matter under advisement, and this
morning rendered a decision, which is
to the effect that the prisoner is en-
titled to five days per month reduction
for the first year; that the second year
begins at the end of the first year, less
the "copper," or in ten months and
eight days; seven days off each month
are allowed for the second year, nine
for the third, and ten for the fourth and
afterward. The construction given to
the first full year, i. e., counting the
"copper" in the year for which it is
allowed, is to be applied to subsequent
years. As Acord's time, under this
ruling, has not expired, the application
was denied.

Sugar House Ward.—On Sunday
evening, October 11th, Bishop Briggs
and Counsel re-organized the Y. M.
and Y. L. M. I. Associations of Sugar
House Ward, which resulted in the
following-named persons being unani-
mously sustained as officers. Presi-
dent of the Y. M. Association, Geo.
Crismon, with Jacob Gibson and Rich-
ard Hemsley as counselors; Jos. A.
Young, secretary; Apollon P. Briggs,
assistant secretary; Edward Wilson,
treasurer; Jacob Garn, librarian.
The officers of the Y. L. Association
for the preceding year were sustained
for another year. President, Mrs.
Annie R. McGhie; counselors, Mrs.
Caroline B. Pratt and Miss Lizzie
Alston; secretary, Miss Louise Sid-
dons; assistant secretary, Mrs. Mary
Staker.
A choir was also organized, with L.
S. Clark as leader; Miss Mabel A.
Young, organist; Miss Emma Crismon,
assistant organist.
A vote of thanks was tendered the
officers of the past year.
The association commences a new
year with every prospect of success,
the officers and members being united
in their efforts to improve.

A Scoundrel.—This morning a com-
plaint was made in the police court
against John J. Burns, by Mrs. Mar-
tin, who resides on the State Road,
charging Burns with having insulted
her. It seems that last evening, about
9 o'clock, Mrs. Martin was on the side-
walk in front of her residence, looking
for her husband, whom she was ex-
pecting to return home. While she
was there a gentleman and lady with
whom she was acquainted came along,
and after conversing with her for a
few moments, passed on. Just then
Burns came up and requested Mrs.
Martin to take a walk with him. This
she promptly refused to do, and turned
to go into her house. The fellow de-
tained her, placing his hand on her
shoulder, and began an attempt to per-
suade her to go with him. At this
 juncture Mr. Martin arrived on the
scene, and Burns slipped off. The
police were notified and arrested
Burns, who pleaded guilty and was
fined \$10 this afternoon.

Accidentally Shot and Killed.—
The following, from the Deseret Tele-
graph line, was received from Moroni,
Utah, to-day, as a special to the
News:
An accident occurred on the west
mountains, eight miles from Moroni,
yesterday, which resulted in the death
of Soren Christensen, aged twenty-
seven. Soren Christensen, Martin
Adolph Taylor and Soren Bradlee
were hunting; they got separated,
Taylor heard a rattling in the oak
brush, which was very thick, and he
(Taylor) thought it was a deer, so he
fired. They went to look for the deer
and to their horror found Christensen
lying dead, the ball going in close by
his left ear and coming out his fore-
head. A Coroner's inquest was held
last night over the body; the verdict
was accidental death.

Confusion of Names.—In alluding
to the grand jurors who were dis-
charged a few days since for not
sneezing every time the Court and
acting Prosecuting Attorney McKay
took snuff, the name of one was given
as N. W. Clayton, which led some peo-
ple into the error of supposing that he
and the Territorial Auditor, Neph W.
Clayton, were identical. The recalci-
trant grand juror who was so summa-
rily "bounced" was Newel H. Clayton.

From Arizona.—John B. Miller,
Esq., well known to many of the read-
ers of the News as a former resident
of Provo, but who has for some
months past made his home at St.
Johns, Apache County, Arizona, where
he has been editing and publishing the
Orion Era, is in this city. He arrived
from his southern home some days
ago, and since that time has
been on a visit to Ogden
and Logan, and will probably also
spend some time in Provo before re-
turning to Arizona. He has had a hard
fight on his hands ever since he
mounted the tripod in endeavoring to
defend the rights of the persecuted
Saluts in Arizona, but he is by no
means disposed to give it up; in fact,
he feels encouraged with the hope that
a better day is about to dawn for the
outraged and long-suffering people of
that region. The era of fraud in Ap-
ache County, at least, seems to be
drawing to a close, and it is
high time that it should,
for it has held almost undisputed sway
there for some time past. Kinear, the
ex-county clerk, who destroyed the
duplicates of the county warrants to
cover up his peculations, and who is
supposed to have burglarized the county
safe and destroyed the records some
months ago, is under three indict-
ments, and was once tried a short time
since, but the jury failed to agree,
eleven of them standing for conviction
and one for acquittal. His bonds were
placed at \$6,000, but "straw" securi-
ties were accepted and the result was
he was soon non est.
Sol. Barth, one of the chief insti-
gators of the anti-"Mormon" crusade
in that region, is also under bonds for
perjury.
The present board of supervisors of
Apache County are doing all they can
to the interest of reform.
Judge Howard has also manifested
a disposition of late to prosecute
real criminals instead of devoting
himself almost exclusively, as he
did for some time, to persecuting the
"Mormons." The change may be due
some what to the stand taken by a
great many of the wealthy and influ-
ential men of the country, who seri-
ously discussed the propriety of or-
ganizing a vigilance committee to rid
the country of the thieves and other
desperate characters who there flour-
ished in defiance of law, while the
"Mormons" monopolized the attention
of the judiciary.
Educational matters are also receiv-
ing more attention than heretofore
throughout the Territory; and though
the residents of Apache County have
all their school teachers appointed by
a non-"Mormon" County Board of In-
struction, instead of the trustees being
allowed to employ whom they choose,
as in other parts of the Territory, they
are not at all disposed to neg-
lect the education of their chil-
dren. In some instances they
are carrying on schools of their own,
independent of the Territorial fund for
the support of free schools, rather than
have their children taught by those who
are appointed for the purpose.
The feeling over the unjust convic-
tion of Bishop David K. Udall, of St.
Johns, of perjury, has become greatly
modified since he was sentenced and
transported to Detroit, and recently
a petition has been got-
ten up by non-"Mormon" residents
of the Territory, many of them offi-
cials, and sent to President Cleveland,
asking for his pardon. It was signed
by all the Apache County officers and
also by District Attorney Zabriske,
who prosecuted him. It was accom-
panied by a certificate from the clerk
of the land office who filled out the
blank affidavit (in signing which it was
held that Bishop Udall had committed
perjury) in which he exonerated
Udall by acknowledging that he had
signed "yes" in the affidavit in place
of a positive "no" uttered by him.
This testimony would have been in-
troduced at the time of the trial had it
not been ruled out. It is to be hoped
that the petition will have the desired
effect.
