does account can be owing to the  
man, and are first to be paid; and he  
that does not do so is a very unjust  
man.

A novelty in photography is promised  
—pictures visible only in the dark,  
—pictures that must be taken into the  
dark cellar to be admired. There are  
certain compounds of phosphorus  
which, after a short exposure to light,  
emit a certain amount of luminosity  
for days and even weeks afterward.  
The image from the photographer's  
lens is allowed to fall upon a plate  
covered with one of these preparations;  
the light excites the surface to phos-  
phorescence wherever it falls; the  
shadows of the image produce an effect.  
When the plate is removed from the  
camera and brought to the light noth-  
ing is visible upon it; but if carried into  
darkness the picture develops  
itself with an unearthly glow, as if it  
had been drawn with the point of a  
quill.

An ordinary smoker of the cheapest  
tobacco consumes daily the average  
amount of three cents worth—90 cents  
a month of 30 days, or \$10.85 in the  
year of 365 days. He will use  
boxes of matches at a cent a piece,  
at least, three pipes per month, or  
cents worth more. Hence seven  
cents per month, or 84 cents per annum,  
must be added. The grand total then,  
a year, is \$11.69, without counting  
the clothing and wasted time.  
If a family be composed of a  
father and two sons, who are smokers,  
there is an annual expense of \$35.37 in  
tobacco. This sum would purchase 1,415  
pounds of bread at two and a half cents  
per pound, or fully enough to feed  
the children. When laboring men  
are alarmed at the prospect of the poor  
for themselves and their families,  
let them think of this!

Two raftsmen were caught recently  
—a big blow on the Mississippi, by  
which many rafts were swamped and  
many steam boats lost their "sky rig-  
gins." The raft was just emerging  
from Lake Pepin as the equal can-  
celing as if suddenly dropped into  
whirlpools, while the waves broke over  
it with tremendous uproar, and ex-  
pecting instant destruction one of the  
men dropped on his knees and com-  
menced praying with a vim equal to the  
emergency. Happening to open his  
eyes for an instant, he observed his  
companion, not engaged in prayer, but  
pushing a pole in the water by the side  
of the raft. "What's that yer doin', Mike?"  
said he, "get down on your knees now, for  
there isn't a minute between us and  
perdition!" "Go easy, Pat," said the other,  
"he's continued to punch with his pole,  
"he's say, now, what's the use of prayin'  
when a feller can tooth bottom with a  
pole!"
