REGISTRATION RULES. THE BULES ADOPTED BY THE COM-MISSION FOR THE APPOINTMENT AND GOVERNMENT OF REGIS-TRARS, ETC.

the persons so appointed, who, pre-vious to entering upon said office, shall take and subscribe an oath or affirmation that they will well and faithfully perform all the duties thereof to the best of their ability, and that they will studiously en-deavor to prevent any fraud, deceit of abuse of any election over which they may preside, and that they are not bigamists or polygamists. If in any preside decline to serve or fail to appear, the deputy registra-tion officer of the precinct shall ap-point a judge or judges to fill the va-cancy, and the persons so appointed shall quality as herein provided. RULE 7. At the meeting of the Commis-sion yesterday afternoon the follow-ing rules were adopted for the ap-pointment and government of reg-istrars, the conduct of the registra-tion and of elections, the making of returns and so out for the delegate election in November:

RULE 1. There shall be appointed one reg-istration officer for each county, and one deputy registration officer for each precinct thereof.




