THE REVOLT IN HERZEGOVINA.

The disturbances in Herzegovina are believed to be serious. Commissioners have been sent by the Porte to tranquillize the country, but there is a report by telegraph that the disturbances are unsuccessful. The whole district between Mostar and the Austrian frontier, down to Ragusa, is in a state of revolt, and the insurgents threaten death to all refusing to join them. The commissioners advise the Porte to send troops at once.

NOTES BEFORE THE COMMISSIONERS.—Coming Lord Mayor's Banquet.

In the House of Commons, to-night, Disraeli stated that the government would proceed with the principal object of the merchant shipping, the judicature and the land transfer bills. He defined what his disposition would be of other measures, but he hoped, with the assistance of the House, to bring their labors to a close in a most satisfactory period.

Or the functionaries invited to the Lord Mayor's international banquet, the following have signified their acceptance—the prefects of the police of Paris, the mayors of Calais and Boulogne, Grasse, Bourges, Clermont and Quebec, and the ambassadors of Brussels, Antwerp and Amsterdam. Seventeen have not yet answered, and twenty-two have been invited, including all the Germans invited to the annual meeting of the Stockholders of the United Order of Tailors, which will be held at their office, Salt Lake City, at one o'clock p.m., Monday, July 16th, 1875, for the election of Officers for the ensuing year.
