

STATE CONFERENCES

The City Council committee on the sewerage question is working in connection with the department of the sewerage, now that the constructed gravity sewer is about to be opened. Last week, in response to a call for bids to care for the sewerage, but one was received, and it seemed to be the wrong way, consequently it was rejected. Now, the committee has decided to enter into negotiation with property owners in the vicinity of the sewerage, to the effect that they utilize the contents as a fertilizer, and thus save the city an expense of \$10,000, which City Engineer Van Dine has estimated. The sewage, after removing the solids and turning the remaining part into the water of the Jordan, will meet with the advancement projects of Salt Lake. As it means the pollution of the lake waters of the Great Salt Lake, the substance of the sewage is turned into the Jordan river. The committee has faith, however, that property owners of the nearby vicinity will be prevailed upon to utilize the contents as a fertilizer, which the municipality will be born to these advantages that will be now virtually a disadvantage.

WATERWORKS COMMITTEE.

The waterworks committee had under consideration several other petitions which were referred to them at the last session of the Council. Among them was one from the city of Ogden, pertaining to a \$6 assessment on the sprinkling of the lawn, he claimed that the city of Ogden had a water pipe to lead the free use of the water from an irrigation ditch, led by Crook Creek stream. Mr. Hill's proposal was to have the waterworks of the city, as a whole for the use of salt water, be rendered equitable and just.

Grand Jurors are now hearing for an extension of the water main to Tenth south and Fifth East was also approved, as there was now not enough water to supply the needs of those who already had the water supply.

Amos B. Clark's petition asked for a refund of certain water rates which had been overpaid by her former husband, Barney Harvey, was also approved.

The committee also turned its attention to the proposition made by the Utah Central railway company to equip the existing outbackment of Percy's canyon. The examination from the railway of the addresses of the Council and superintendent called, and the committee decided to defer its opinion to the parties addressed, that the matter be placed on the with the regular order.
