He Now Asks Our Government to Collect \$50,000 Damages For Him from Russia.

New York, May 21.—The Herald says John Ginsburg has asked the secretary of state to collect \$50,000 from Russia to reimburse him for his losses. Ginsburg, a Russian, became an American citizen without asking the consular authorities. He was born in Lohubsk, Matinsk Oblas, Poland. He came to America when he was 14 years of age and on August 10, 1904, took out naturalization papers in the United States district court in Wilmington, Del.

He saved a little money and in October, 1904, he sent his wife and child to his parents. He secured a passport good for two years signed by Secretary Gresham. When he reached Havana, he was met by his wife and child. He was examined and was approved by Charles H. Burke, the American consul at Havana. He then returned to his home in Poland.
