OLD BRIDGE IMMORTALIZED BY BURNS.



The town council of Ayr. Scotland, has decided to pull down the old bridge herewith illustrated, which is the "auld brig of Ayr" immortalized by Robert Burns. The prophecy that the poet put into the mouth of the old structure when a new one was built in 1788-"I'll be a brig when ye're a shapeless cairn" -was actually fulfilled, the new bridge having collapsed in 1877. Lord Rosehery is making an effort to save the old landmark, which is believed to have been built in the reign of Alexander III. of Scotland.
