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WALDEN IS SICK.

And Therefore Could Not Wait Upon

Justice Whitcomb Today.

Had Presenting Attorney Deane

Wanted Walden's "Body" Preserved,

In full expectation that the charge

of assault produced against County

Register J. H. Walden, arising

out of the assault between him-

self and Judge Powers last

Monday, would be investigated

by Justice Whitcomb's court today,

the court named for the continuance

of the hearing.

Justice Deane, the complainant and

"accused" party, was one of the

earliest arrivals, accompanied by At-

torney H. H. McCallum, who is as-

sisted with Assistant County At-

torney on behalf of the prosecution.

But there was no sign of the de-

fendant, and so an adjournment

Attorney Deane, addressing Jus-

tice Whitcomb, said: "I understand

that in the case of the people of the

Territory of Utah against J. H. Wal-

den, charged with assault and battery,

the defendant never gave a bond.

Is that correct?"

The justice replied that it was.

Mr. Deane: "That the defendant is

slightly in the custody of the sheriff."

Again the justice said: "Whereas

under the constitution of the ter-

ritory, the defendant is to be pre-

sented within a reasonable time

at a proper showing to show why

he is not present, and that the sheriff

is authorized to do so, I have

reminded you of the fact that Mr.

Walden, the defendant's attorney,
