## "MORMON" COLONIZERS.

The success of our people who have taken up their abode in Mexico has attracted a great deal of attention. Every newspaper of importance has something to say about the "Mormon" colonies in that country making the desert to blossom as the rose, with other more original remarks. The numbers of "Mormon" residents in Mexico are greatly exaggerated, but the accounts of their prosperity are genuine.

## A SLIM OBJECTION.

## CURRENT POLITICAL ISSUES.

The New York *Mail* and *Express* says that the great political issues of the time are the tariff, reciprocity, the currency, civil service reform, and a free ballot.
