WATER. THE scarcity of water in City Creek and the increasing demand for water for irrigation, render the strict enforcement of the following provisions of the "Ordinance in relation to the Salt Lake City Water Works," etc., absolutely necessary:

WATER. Sprinklers for lawns, gardens, yards, and sidewalks must be used only for the purposes expressed in the license; and no sprinkler shall be used for sprinkling the street outside of the sidewalk, unless such privilege is included in the license and paid for accordingly.

WATER. Water consumers are not allowed to waste any water, or allow it to be wasted; nor to use it for any purpose not stated in their license; nor to allow unlicensed persons to draw water from the pipes for irrigating purposes.
