Cross was for 17 years engaged in the purchase of animals for menageries, and from long study of heir dispositions and peculiarities he is a convert to the theory that all ani-mals will eventually become what man chooses to make them. For instance, he characterizes the bull-dog as the entieman of his species, with more uteiligence and discernment than any other, until he learns how to fight and

When the owner returned he was apprised of the insur-rection in his menagerie, and promptly armed himself with a stout stick as a preparation for war. He tried to place a board over that same hole, but the lion resented the intrusion, and the
