

The Indiana Conference.  
MARION, Williamson County,  
Illinois, Sept. 24, 1895.

To the Editor:  
I take pleasure in hereby submitting  
for the benefit of all interested, the re-  
port of our conference, which was held  
on the 14th, 15th and 16th of the pre-  
sent month at the new community  
of "New" school house, Johnson county,  
Illinois, about four miles southwest of  
Vienna. The weather was fine and  
quite warm, and the roads were in  
very good condition, thus affording the  
opportunity for the gathering of the  
large crowds that were present from a  
radius of twenty miles or more.

Saturday at 10 a.m., there were pres-  
ent in their respective places the presi-  
dent of the mission, Elder James H.  
Cotton, and traveling Elders Ira E.  
Bradford, John C. Allen, D. R.  
Anderson, Christopher Goss, J. H.  
Tanner, Noah H. Heaton, A. M.  
Archibald, Levi H. Haynes, Isaac  
Harris, John H. Sturz, John H. Blackey,  
Jos. G. Banks and Jos. Timmons.

After the opening session Elder  
James H. Cotton spoke upon the  
conference and made some remarks  
upon the principles of faith. Elder  
Joseph Emery followed upon the  
stage and made some remarks  
upon the principles of repentance  
with illustrations.

While the above named meeting was  
in progress, a buggy stopped at the  
door and several men descended from  
the vehicle and were introduced, when  
one remarked, "Here, I know this is  
the right place, that you have just the  
right kind of a ring to it" and they  
were invited to enter. They were  
Marshall D. Clark, Francis M. Hause-  
man, William H. Craven, Christian  
Larsen, Walter C. Humphreys, Nels  
P. Anderson and Edward H. Boyer,  
our trustees. Who had just arrived  
from Zion, to assist us in the labor of

The noon hours were spent in supply-  
ing the horses, men with  
the delicious prepared and spread out  
upon the grass by the good  
sisters, who while there were singing  
and dancing in unison in the hall.

At 2 p.m., when meeting was again re-  
sumed, Elder Cotton spoke upon the  
Holy Spirit of promise in connection  
with the Gospel. Elder Hauseman re-  
quested to have the audience addressed  
upon the necessity of having the  
temper of the heart right, the necessity  
of the laying on of hands as a

Gospel ordinance now as formerly

days. Elder Hayes' testimony  
showed the necessity of works  
with faith in God and his commandments.

Dr. Clark spoke of the  
"Strong" mission of the Elders, show-  
ing the difference between their mis-  
sion and that of the same teachers  
of the present day, showing  
the necessity of the laying on of hands  
to the Elders, warning voices and of  
accepting their teachings; how strong  
and spirit-filled testimony in the truth  
and grandeur of the work. Said that  
there was a positive and decided  
progress throughout the

Northern states mission, beginning

that evening at noon, for increased

meetings and power and families for  
the promulgation of the Gospel and  
the health and strength of all effluvia  
of the earth etc. He advised the  
brethren of the Lord to be the  
happy lot of all.
