Kellogg asked Butler if he under-
stood it to say that the President
would not veto the Senate bill.

The Speaker, interrupting, said
that was an improper question,
never to be discussed, adding in re-
spect to the Speaker's right to discuss
the intention of the chair to the matter,
that he did not notice Butler's re-
mark, or he would have stopped him; that it was an invasion of the
dignity and right of the House of
Representatives to allude to the
possibility of the President's veto-
ing a bill.

Butler attempted to explain the
matter in a negative and not in a
positive sense, but he was again
rebuked by the Speaker, who per-
emptorily forbade further discussion of
the matter, but not before Con-
rad had declared that Butler had
given to the House the opinion of
that he gave.

The bill being again before the
House, the previous question was
moved and seconded on all the
pending amendments, which were
voted on seriatim, and all rejected.

On motion of Maynard the 7th
section was voted to be origi-
nally intended to be opened
without circulation, and to be
struck out without years and names,
and on motion of Biery the 8th
section, providing for a monthly
issue of two millions in gold notes,
as a substitute for that amount of
greenbacks, to be cancelled and de-
stroyed, and unredeemed, was also
struck out 149 to 85.

Negley then moved an additional
section, limiting the amount of
greenbacks in circulation to four
hundred millions, and providing for
their convertibility into 3.65 per
cent. bonds.

Kelly moved his similar proposi-
tion, as a substitute for Negley's,
and, under the operation of the pre-
vious question, Kelly's amendment
was substituted and then re-
jected, yeas 118, nays 122, and after a
long parliamentary wrangle the
House adjourned.

THE SENATE—Wants to Sup-
press Poligamy in Utah—Ex-
tension Treaty Ratified.

WASHINGTON, 10.—The House
committee on foreign relations have
finished the consular bill.

The most important amendment
tabled in the office of Consul Gen-
eral at Berlin, Melbourne, and at
the city of Mexico, and a consulate at
Bucharest.

District Attorney Carey, of Salt
Lake, advocated, before the House
Judiciary Committee to-day giving
the U. S. Courts in Utah proper
and exclusive jurisdiction in criminal
offenses, and thus to provide for the
suppression of polygamy.

The ratification of the extradition
treaty between the U. S. and Sal-
vador is officially proclaimed.

Avery Confirmed.

The Senate has confirmed the
nomination of Benjamin P. Avery,
for minister to China.

American on Trial.

Kay, Way, 10.—Hawaii letter
says that Frederick A. Doolley,
formerly member of Congress from
Florida, but more recently United
States collector at Jacksonville,
arrived at Havana recently, and
staid several weeks. He then went to
Santiago de Cuba and on Friday
the American consular agent at
Navyolas, stating that he came from
the interior. The consul took him
to the governor, who referred the
matter to General Portillo, com-
manding the Puerto Principe, who or-
dered the arrest of both. The con-
sul was subsequently released, but
was then retained, upon promises
promising him being soon freed
on his person. His trial is now in
progress, and if he is found guilty
of communicating with the insur-
gents he will probably be exe-
cuted.
