Inasmuch as on this occasion they passed the imperial palace, where the emperor reviewed them, it is to be presumed that they are doing their best to look military. They do not, however, present a very soldierly appearance, and it is safe to say that they will look even less marial in the field. It is estimated that Korea has only about 18,000 semitrained troops, so that, aside from the moral aid, she will be of omparatively little assistance to Japan, her new ally.

THE FORTIFICATIONS AT PORT ARTHUR.



The reason for calling Port Arthur "the Gibraltar of the east" will be apparent to any one viewing the great rock which commands the entrance to the inner roads leading to the harbor. The imposing double fort at the top of this promontory is such as to make a hostile fleet hesitate before attempting to enter the channel. The Chinese regarded Port Arthur as impregnable, yet the Japs took it. Since it came into Russian possession the czar's government has spared no expense in making it one of the most perfectly fortified harbors in the world. For this reason the recent Japanese achievements about Port Arthur take their places in the front rank of naval accomplishment.
