

SWITCHMAN KILLED ON BINGHAM ROAD

Hightone Once More Responsible for Death in Accident Yesterday Afternoon.

Another switchman occurred at 1 p.m. Friday on the Rio Grande highline at Bingham, due, it is stated, to mixed orders, complicated by a heavy snow-storm. Emery Broadstreet, a switchman, who was riding on the footboard of light engine 292, was instantly killed, and Engineer William Butler and Fireman N. S. Wiltsie were seriously injured, as their engine crashed into a string of ore cars being pushed up the grade a short distance above Bingham.

Broadstreet with Foreman Orson Manning of the switching crew, were to go on the footboard, following a driving snowstorm, and were unable to see what was ahead of them. Switchman C. L. Buchanan riding at the head of the ore cars, riding with the direction of the wind, saw the light engine ahead and yelled for the two men to jump, at the same time leaping himself, and escaping injury. But the men on the footboard did not hear in the howling gale, and crash came hurling them to one side, unharmed, while Broadstreet was caught and crushed between the engine and the cars. Engineer Butler was thrown through his cab window, and was found clinging to the injector on the side of the boiler, with the sash of the cab window about him. He was painfully cut about the head and face, and was thrown to the ground and badly shaken up, besides being cut and bruised. The cars were traveling up the grade at 12 miles an hour, and the light engine was running down the grade at about eight miles an hour.

It is claimed there was a misunderstanding between the yardmen at Cuprum on the high line, Mr. Foreman of the ore cars, and the following switchman. The dead man's parents live at Urana, Ill. The body was removed to Bingham to be prepared for burial.

SCARLET FEVER SPREADS.

Weekly Report of Board of Health Shows Twenty-five Cases.

The spread of scarlet fever continues unabated according to the weekly report of the city board of health issued today. There were 26 cases reported during the week. For the same period there were 16 cases of typhoid fever, seven cases of diphtheria, four cases of smallpox, one case of measles, one case of pneumonia and 11 cases of chickenpox—a total of 51 cases. At the end of the week there were 11 houses quarantined on account of scarlet fever, 15 houses on account of diphtheria, eight houses on account of smallpox and four smallpox patients in the isolation hospital.

During the week there were 31 births, 15 males and 16 females. There were 22 deaths reported for the week, 13 males and 10 females. One body was shipped here for burial.

ROE ANSWERS DR. PAGET.

Publicity Agent for Christian Scientists Takes Issue on Statements.
