MARKET DISPLAYED MORE STRENGTH

Black Jack and Iron Blossom Make Substantial Gains Over Yesterday's Prices.

BECK TUNNEL IS FIRMER

Lower Mammoth, However, Showed Weakness—Closing Quotations and Sales.

More buying orders were in evidence during today's early calls of the mining exchange and as a result there was a marked recovery from the low prices that prevailed yesterday. The bottom appears to have been reached yesterday forenoon, for in the afternoon brokers began bidding up and the practice was continued this morning. Black Jack and Iron Blossom were very much stronger; the latter, particularly, which began at \$1.80 and sold up to \$2.02. Beck Tunnel was also in better tone; but Lower Mammoth ended with a shrinkage charged against it. Mountain Lake was bought at \$1 and \$2 cents. Drifting both ways from the shaft, the ore is rich in workings of this lease, and the vein in both drifts now has a width of seven feet, and is producing 10 tons of ore daily, one-half of which goes in to the smelter at Goldfield.

ATTENTION LIGHT; MEETING POSTPONED

Organization of Branch of American Mining Congress Not Effected Last Night.

NEWHOUSE AND JACKLING.

Both Were Out of Town—Addresses By John Dern, Temporary Chairman, and Others.

Only about 25 persons were in attendance at the meeting of mining men at the Commercial club last evening, and owing to the absence from the city of Samuel Newhouse, D. C. Jackling and others, it was decided to postpone any action to the organization of the local branch of the American mining congress.

The meeting was called to order by H. L. Thompson, representative of the congress, and John Dern was chosen temporary chairman and W. E. Vigors, temporary secretary. The object of the gathering was stated by Mr. Dern, but Capt. Duncan MacVie thought there ought to be a better representation of the men present, and for that reason, he urged that steps to effect a permanent organization be deferred. Others took the same view of the matter, with the result as stated. Short addresses were made by Chairman Dern, Capt. MacVie, H. C. Baker of Ogden, J. R. Belcher, Col. G. W. P. Dorsey and a number of others. H. L. Thompson was called for and in responding stated that although a resident of Salt Lake, he favored Salt Lake as the permanent headquarters of the American mining congress, and gave as his reasons that he recognized the fact that it is the center of the metallurgical field of the west, whereas, Denver is off to one side.
