Tours.-The government is begining to prepare the public through the press, for the cession of French territory to Germany.

Heroic sorties are incessant at Metz. The Prussian commander has given orders for increased vigilance. The Prussian Commissariat has been

removed to avoid capture. The foreign ambassadors at Tours are negotiating for quarters in Bordeaux, in view of the contemplated removal of the government thither. 1 1111

Prefect De La Forge, who so energetically defended St. Quentin with the national gardes behind the batteries, and repuised the Prussians, had received no military education. He was the editor of a Journal.

Advices from the invaded depart-ments show that the situation is grave, owing to the enormous and repeated requisitions of the Prussians. The inhabshooters. Those already organized have obtained some marked successes against the Prussians. In many cases stragglers, or small bodies of the enemy have been destroyed.

Prince Fredetick Charles is ill with typhus fever, and has been obliged to leave the army. It is said he is now

at Ferrieres.

Despatches from Maintenon, Maleserbes, La Grange and Charters, announce the presence of the Prussians in those places.

Several encounters have taken place at Drieux. The French Tireurs have captured great quantities of cattle lately that had been taken from the people by the Prussians in their requisitions. Gen. Bourbaki is expected in Tours.

MALESHERBES 8 .- The Prussians were massed near Etampes on Friday. Several columns passed through Forte St.

Croix for Etampes.

The mitrailleuses now made are not such as were first used, of whose construction the Emperor has the secret. Many attempts have been unsuccessfully made by special correspondents to leave Paris or send out dispatches.
