

After today the Mercur Mining com-pany and the De Lamar Mercur Mines company will be amalgamated and known as the Consolidated Mercur Gold Mining company. A telegram was received today by Secretary W. H. Cun-ningham from Capt De Lamar's New ningham from Capi De Lamar's New York attorneys stating that the new articles of incorporation had been duly received and filed under the laws of New Jersey. Within the next few days Treasurer George H. Dern will remove his desk to the offlees of the new com-pany in the Dooly block. The Mercur company's office will remain in the Mc-Couriek for the newsent and Fred Dern Cornick for the present and Fred Dern will attend to the winding up of the company's affairs, after which a divi-dend of something like \$40,000 is promused to the stockholders. It is stated that the Mercur mill will continue to treat ballings and that ore will also be sent to the mill for the present at least. This will not last long as the track is all in readiness to con-

vey Mercur ore to the great Golder Gate mill. Manager George Dern will leave for the mine tomorrow to make the final clean-up of the Mercur company.

CONSTELLATION GROUP.

Meeting This Evening Will Likely Put Finishing Touch to the Deal.

A meeting will take place this evening between the committee appointed by the Constellation Mining company of Park City and Willard Thompson with a view of closing up the deal for that group of claims. It is stated that the proposition to bond the property for two years for \$115,000 has been agreed to. 


