We understand that it was offered to the Western Union Telegraph Company at that price; but it was subsequently reduced to \$50,000. The Telegrapher, of New York, states that that company had an extansitive examination of the val-idity of the patent made by eminent patent lawyeers and experts, "and decimed to puice chass it at any price."
