Another Silver Bill John Jay Knox, comptroller of currency, who was formerly at the head of the mint bureau, has prepared an important bill on the all-ver question, for introduction into sury department. It provides that all silver dollars, hereafter coined, shall contain 480 grains and nine-tenths fineness, and shall bear the same device as the present trade dollar, except that the word "one" be substituted for the word "trade" and the figures 480 for 420. This coin shall be legal tender for all amounts, and be exchangeable for gold coin at Washington and New York, provided that whenever they are presented for exchanged in such sums that show the amount outstanding is redundant, the secretary of the treasury may diminish or discontinue their coinage until otherwise ordered.
