PRESIDENT WILFORD WOODRUFF.

President Wilford Woodruff, the Prophet, Seer, and Revelator, passed away peacefully this morning, September 1st. Such was the intelligence brought over the wire today in the President's office. It came unannounced to all his friends who have been under the impression that the beloved leader of the people of God was enjoying good health. Considering his advanced age, still there, together with the Saints throughout the world, were, in a measure prepared for his departure at the time of one who so long had stood in their midst, a tower of strength in times of tempests and an example of living faith at all times.

Wilford Woodruff was the fourth President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He was born at Farmington New Haven, Hartford Co., Connecticut, March 1, 1817. He was the third son of Abigail and Nathan Thompson Woodruff. From his early youth and in the midst of a very life, he meditated on religious subjects. On December 28, 1822, he first heard the Gospel from the lips of Elder Zenas Punipher and Elijah Chesser. To hear the truth was, with him, to believe it, and on January 1, 1827, he received baptism. The following April he went to Kirtland, and became acquainted with Joseph, the Prophet. In May he marched with "Zion's Camp" into Missouri.

At this time he realized a strong desire to become a messenger of the Gospel to his fellowmen, and as if in answer to his prayers he was ordained a Prophet on Nov. 1, 1834, and in January, the following year, he started on a missionary tour through Arkansas, Tennessee and Kentucky. He went on foot and without purse or scrip, and traveled 2,000 miles. He had 12 meetings, baptized forty-three persons and organized three branches. He had many wonderful experiences during this tour and numerous manifestations of the power of the Almighty.

His second missionary tour was commenced in May, 1837. On this he visited Maine and the Fox Islands. For two years he labored faithfully in his mission and baptized many converts. While at North West Haven he received notice of his appointment to the Apostleship, and was ordained to that exalted position on April 26, 1838.

In the following August he set out for a mission to Great Britain, where his labors were crowned with success, perhaps never witnessed since the days of the first Apostles of our Savior. After eight months labor he baptized 1,000 persons, including prominent preachers of many denominations. He then returned home and reached Nauvoo in October, 1838.

Two years later he was laboring as a missionary in the eastern states, but returned to Nauvoo upon hearing of the martyrdom of the Prophet Joseph. In 1844 he again was sent to perform a mission to England but he returned in time to join the exodus from Nauvoo.

In 1847 he traveled with the Pioneers across the plains and was one of the first to arrive in this valley. In 1858 he went north on a mission to the eastern states, returning in 1860. In this year he was elected to the Senate of the provisional State of Deseret and served for twenty-one years in the legislative assembly of Utah. President Woodruff was closely identified with every movement for the advancement of Utah and the West, over which he presided for thirty years and patriotic era.

When President John Taylor became President of the Church, Wilford Woodruff was sustained as President of the Council of Apostles, and at the general conference in April, 1888, he became the President of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints with President George F. Cannon and President Joseph F. Smith as co-presidents.

President Woodruff's administration has been one of peace and good will towards all. Among the Saints he was honored and loved, and even those of other religious views than his were

willing to look to him with reverence and esteem.

His life work has been a most remarkable one. From the beginning of its ministry in 1830 and to the close of the year 1888, he had traveled 17,000 miles; built 1,000 missions, preached 2,000 discourses, organized 47 branches of the Church and 17 presiding priests. He traveled in England, Scotland and Wales and in 21 states and 6 territories in the United States.

The family and intimate associates as well as the Saints in general, the survivors of President Woodruff from other shores of action, will be told as a great loss, yet they will be ever lost of gratitude for the Providence that so long preserved him among them. His memory will be a lesson to future generations, inspiring us in faith, diligence and perseverance in the service of God.

Fall of years and fall of hours have passed along to his great reward. Earth contained no other home for him than what he had already gained, nor have accepted of anything more than what he already had. What have caused him to sleep? What a magnificent spectacle to contemplate is it, when a man weighed down with the accumulated years, all save the half-year spent devoted to the cause of God and his fellow men, at least yields up his mortality and lays down the cross imposed upon him without any sorrow. Who has reposed or slept upon his master? These who have been accounted great as the world appears are now gone, gone like the plankings off the world following them in the mists, and the realms of mind, ranging in their care with their last consciousness; but how many of these have been, as all men under every circumstance, with God or the master? How many but have made those whom they claimed to be a part the sleeping ones at their feet? What have these poor souls, who have contended greatly for him, the world to his eyes may have been a constant source of trouble and all others have seemed to be forgetful of a life of usefulness if not greatness. They doubtless formed a living family, kind friends, comfortable home and such circumstances as make existence a pleasure, especially early in life, and yet, though tried and tested, have laid aside their life and left away among these lonely souls who share the whole anguish through the trials life has only prepared that are not, and the offspring of the birds in the bushes, the only companion that is found?

There is something more in his coming, in his breathing and suffering and dying for us. The sacrifice he made in order that we might be free like he was in life was great, too holy, too innocent to be permitted to perish from the hearts and minds of men. In the spirit world he has joined the immortal company, having been numbered with them and known no much less because of our enforced degradation, there must be a record kept which sometimes will be opened and read; and then the unknown dead who died for freedom and for us will receive a reward such as nothing life can bestow. May your rest upon the breast of the common brother be peaceful and serene until you are called forth to a life even more fervent than the one you laid down that date and the Cause might thenceforward and forever after be free.

THE PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.

Trustworthy information regarding the Philippine Islands is not abundant. From descriptions recently published it appears that the group can be regarded as consisting of three distinct divisions, each being different from the other with regard to the characteristics of the population and other conditions. The inhabitants of each division make their principal abode in three quite different districts, in the far north are the Ilocano, Malaig-Tarlos, who themselves are a type of converted Malayo-polynesian people with smooth black hair, blue eyes, black skin and copper colored skin, inhabit the middle portion of the archipelago, and the Bicolans, or Visayans, centred in the south. A group of islands in the extreme south, however, is also a pronouncedly native or "indigenous" race of people, and includes the Sulu and Mindanao, who are said to be descendants of the ancient tribes of Hindostan. The Suluans bear a strong resemblance to the Dyaks of the Borneo coast.

In asking the white how many women are engaged in prostitution, the reply is that they were very young. The evil effects of this vice are manifested in the fact that the natives are disengaged from the pursuit of agriculture, and the habit of promiscuity is universally condemned.

All the religious sects in the Philippines would advise against such a law. Persons having regard for the welfare of the people, however, would naturally be in favor of it. All the efforts of the state, knowing the deadly effects of this habit, have been made to prohibit it. The great evils it works upon the country itself, the country's wealth, economy, social life, the health of the people, the health of the law, and that would be all that would be necessary. Not a few Chinese, Japanese and Portuguese, however, are engaged in prostitution, and the important port of Manila, which has a population of 1,000,000, is 16,000 half-miles from the nearest port of local call. The half-mile distance of Manila, however, from the nearest port of call, is greater than such succeeding distances between Spanish and native women, as an individual case, and the Chinese American empires one-fourth of the domestic population. But, while the situation of Europe, Asia, and Australia, however, is not so bad, the tendency among the Chinese, however, is to increase with such succeeding distances, and the native and wild type. Today only one-half of London, with its great resources for producing hemp, sugar, tea, tobacco, cotton, cotton and wool, is under cultivation, while a single railway, 150 miles long, affects the soil areas of rapid transportation in an island which is larger in area than Ohio and has little smaller than the state of New York.

The Chicago River, from which the above is gathered, says that London has the climate, the soil, the fresh water rivers and lakes and the situation of the city to make it a veritable paradise for the modern agriculturist.

The great communities are making great strides and seem to be continuing to do so for some time. The numbers have been almost but not so far below as 100,000 of a decadal nature to well-gotten together. Regarding this, the Chicago News is but to say:

"Ninety-eight is probably a quantity which will be exceeded in 1899."

There can be no doubt that the habit of smoking is especially injurious when

smoked before the age of 20, especially if it follows that it is the duty of the State to allow such a flagrant evasion of the truth as it is.
