

LAST GRAND RUSH IN LOWER HOUSE.

Twenty-Nine Bills Went Through
The Hopper Yesterday
Afternoon.

NEW IRRIGATION MEASURES.

Bill for an Experiment Farm Goes
Through—Tolton Rises to
Explain.

As stated in last evening's "News," there was a veritable flood of bills in the lower house yesterday afternoon, no less than 29 new measures being introduced during the session. Of these, twelve were referred to the committee on agriculture, and the remainder to the committee on public lands. The rush was occasioned by the fact that the session was to close on Friday, and it was necessary to get the bills introduced before that time. From now on, therefore, new bills will be few and far between, for which some of the session, if not all, will be truly thankful. The last bill is one of a bunch of ten introduced by Miller and bears the number 23.

SHEEP BILL WINS.

Following the introduction of bills, which moved for a reconsideration of S. B. 45, an act to establish a state board of sheep commissioners. The motion carried and the bill passed by a vote of 34 yeas and 6 nays.

EXPERIMENT FARM BILL.

Then came H. B. 138, providing for the establishment of a central Utah experiment station and appropriating the sum of \$10,000. Stockey moved its reconsideration for the reason that a joint committee was now considering a bill looking to the provision of a duplicate of studies in the public schools, the result of which might affect the measure under discussion. Friends of the bill opposed the motion, as the measure was argued, was one of the most important before the house, and should be acted upon without delay. The motion lost.

LYMAN FOR ECONOMY.

Lyman moved to cut down the appropriation from \$10,000 to \$5,000, as he felt that the state could ill afford to make such a large appropriation at this time. This precipitated a spirited debate on economy. Roberts, among others, averring that it was false economy to cut down appropriations in agriculture, as this was the chief industry of the state. Joseph took issue with the gentleman's remark and contended that mining was the foremost industry of the state.

WILSON TO THE RESCUE.

This brought Wilson to his feet with the telling statement that "He who makes two blades of grass to grow where only one grew before, is a benefactor. What does the non-producer amount to?" he asked. "Why, absolutely nothing." The speech did its work. The motion to reduce the appropriation was lost and the bill passed on a vote of 34 yeas to 11 nays, the roll call being as follows:

TOLTON EXPLAINS.

At this point in the proceedings, Tolton arose to a question of personal privilege. He said it had come to him that his appeal from the decision of the chair Tuesday night had been construed by some as an evidence that he had personal feelings against the speaker. He disavowed. He had acted in good faith in the least personal manner. Wilson desired to make a speech along similar lines, but he was promptly ruled out of order, and took his seat protesting against the speaker's ruling.

BILLS PASSED.

H. B. 95 by Edwards, relating to the state board of corrections, was next taken up and passed by a vote of 33 yeas and 10 nays.

H. B. 35 by Roberts, relating to the compensation of members of boards of education in cities and prohibiting them

from taking school contracts, was passed by a vote of 41 yeas and one nay. Joseph being the refractory member.

H. B. 42 by Woodruff, enlarging the powers of city councils, was discussed somewhat and finally referred to a conference committee. Woodruff, Miller and Tolton being named by the speaker.

H. B. 67 by Roberts, fixing the fees of district and county clerks, went through by unanimous vote.

GIVEN ASSISTANCE.

During the session Chairman Marks of the committee on public funds asked for and was granted permission to employ assistance in checking up the military expenses in Carbon county. Wilson asked if the committee had discovered any evidence of fraud, whereupon Marks replied that he had not, but that it desired to investigate the matter thoroughly in order to quiet certain ugly rumors that had been circulated.

Friends of Gen. Pace of Utah county sent in a petition for his relief, giving his history as a soldier and a legislator, and saying that he was now an inmate of the insane asylum at an advanced age. The petition was referred to the committee on ways and means.

An invitation from Fire Chief Bywater to witness a fire drill was accepted with thanks, and Joseph, Curtin and Austin were named as a committee to arrange for the time.

A communication from Gov. Cutler, calling attention to the law giving bona fide settlers prior to 1894 the preference in the purchase of school lands, was referred to the committee on public lands.

At 5 p. m. the house adjourned till 2 o'clock this afternoon.
