President Young's Trip North.

Sept. 6 .- President Brigham Young and lady, accempanied by Pres. D. H. Wells and lady, Elder G. A Smith, Bishop E. D. Woolley and lady, Elders T. W. Ellerbeck, G. D. Watt, B. Young, jun., Geo. W. Thatcher and ladv, Theodore Mc Kean, Joseph Taylor, Robt. J. Golding, Nelson Empy, Edwin Woolley and Alexander Bullock, left G. S. L. City, about 10 a.m., and halted at Christopher Layton's, Kay's Ward, about 1 p.m., where the company dined. At 3 continued northward. On the way the President inspected the new Weber bridge, with which he was highly satisfied: reached Bishop C. W. West's, Ogden City, about six in the evening. During the evening the martial band serenaded the town, playing martial and patriolic airs.

- 7th. - The Saints met in the Tabernacle. Bishop Woolley opened the meeting by prayer. Prests. Brigham Young and Daniel H. Wells preached, after which the President showed the difference in the cash outlay of the emigration this season, compared with that of 1856.

Benediction by Elder George A. Smith. By special request of Pres. Young, Patriarch James Lake and wife, who were sick, were prayed for.

At 2 p.m., Elder Abraham Palmer opened the meeting by prayer. Elders Geo. A. Smith and E. D. Woolley preached.

Sunday, 8th .- Elder Lorenzo Snow arrived at Ogden and opened the meeting by prayer. Pres. Wells preached, followed by Elder Watt. Afternoon, the sacrament was administered, and Pres. B. Young preached.

These meetings were held in the Ogden Tabernacle (a building, 50 by 100 feet),

which was densely crowded. Evening, the President and company proceeded to Willard, Elder L. Farr and C. W.

West accompanying. Here the party were met by Elder E. T. Benson and Judge Peter Maughn, of Cache Valley. The Saints at Willard met in their school-house, and were addressed by Prests. Brigham Young and D. H. Wells and others.

- 9 h .- The President and company proceeded northward, and immediately after crossing the divide and entering Cache Valley were met by Capt. Thomas Ricks' company of Logan mounted minute men, bearing a U.S. flag. Two miles further on, Capt. James Haslem's band met and returned with the party discoursing loudly with their brass music. Arrived at Wellsville by 2 p.m. Dined. Held meeting. Pres. B. Young preached. Proceeded to L gan City.

- 10 h .- The Saints in Cache Valley met at the Logan bowery. Prayer by Pres. Dan. H. Wells, who addressed the meeting. Afterwards President Brigham Young preached.

Afternoon, meeting opened by prayer from Elder Lorenzo Snow. Elders Geo. A. Smith. Lorenzo Snow and E. D. Woolley preached. President Young made a few remarks.

The bowery being too small, the boards which encircled it were taken down on three sides to accommodate the assemblage. Choirs from the various settlements were in

attendance and vied laudably with each other in singing alternately.

- 11th .- President and party left Logan on their return a little after 8 a.m., and were escorted by many citizens to the divide leading into Box Elder Valley. Arrived at Brigham City, which was extensively decorated with Union flags. Meeting held in Court House, which was crowded. Elders D. H. Wells and Geo. A. Smith preached, as Pres. Young's incessant preaching rendered him unable to address them.

Benediction by Elder L. Snow.

After meeting the party proceeded to Ogden. - 12 h .- Started from Ogden at 9 a.m. Nooned at Layton's, and arrived in G. S. L. City at 5.30 p.m.

The people in the various settlements were much pleased to see and hear from Prest. Young and his friends.

The Indians at Box Elder were disaffected, and in the northern settlements of Cache had stolen sixty horses.
