There is a carelessness, a deadness, an apathy, a listlessness that exists to a great extent among the Latter-day Saints, and there never was a stronger proof of this than that which was exhibited here yesterday. I asked mys-l', as I looked over the empty beaches, Where are all the Bishops, have they not time to attend the Quar terly Conference? Oh, shame on such men! are they worthy to hold a place in the Bishopric and associate with the holy priesthood God? they are deserating the holy principles by which they ought o ne governed Where are thei Counselors, I asked myself; and where a e the Priests and Teachers and Deacons? Is there no interest manifes ed in the church and king in m of God, or in the Zion he is about to establish? Not much with many of them. Where were these thousands of Feventies and High Priests, and Elders? The great maj rity of them were not here; but to-day they are, and I thought I would alk to them while here and not when absent. Are the things of God of so small import ance, are the issues of life, the destinies of the world and the salvation of the living and the dead of so small importance, that we cannot afford time to spend a day once a quarter in attending to the dur ties of our office, in representing our different districts, and in fulfilling the duties of our priesthood, and the obligations God has placed upon us? I tell you, ye Elders of Israel who neglect these things and who shirk your duties, God win remove your candlestick out of its place, and that speedly, unless you repent. And I say so to the Bishops, and I say so to all Israel who hold the holy priesthood. We are not here to do our own will, bu the will of our Heavenly Father who sent us.
