OTHERS WHO SHOULD BE BETTER.

A Condition Existing That Other States Should Be Paid the Expenses of Public Roads.

The News has pointed out already the fact that the number of unemployed men in the city would not be regarded as the aggregate of the three states which were last year employed in the country. The people between 18 and 25 years of age were not included in the count, and, therefore, the legislature would not be aware of the number of unemployed.

There are more working men who have given up work for the relief committee in each division, than at those men here, but depending on them. For three, four or five months these families have had to sustain the without benefit of employment and wages to support. They have gone on credit where they could for the necessities of life, but they can go no more unless they can find some kind of employment.

These are the working men who are fully entitled to their relief, and are part of the community that deserves to be given work to earn an honest living for themselves and families.

There is another class—men who have no families, and who can get employment. They cannot work without some opportunity of earning the means of subsistence. This class also has been given employment, and is engaged in carrying out the plans of the Relief Committee.

But there is a third class, some of whom have obtained employment on Capitol Hill, under the legislative representation. This class is to be considered as a new society, and should be given active service until the close of the year.
