ODIN CONDITIONS.

Tunnel in Park City Mine Has Been Run to 400-Foot Point.

Wednesday a Park Record man was up at the Odin property and found conditions such that certainly must be gratifying to the owners and promising for the future of the camp. It is not yet a mine, but it is evident that only necessary and capital is all that is necessary to uncover one. The tunnel is now in nearly 400 feet, and the entire distance is through a formation that makes one and invariably leads to it. The last 30 feet has been in ore, and in the face there is a five-foot vein carrying two feet of iron copper and the remainder lead and high grade carbonate. It is getting better all the time and it is the opinion of all who visit the property that a large and richly paying permanent ore body is not far distant. The owners are prepared to prosecute work all winter, and it is very probable that occasional shipments will be made, realizing sufficient funds to pay for development work. Park City is in better hands, for she knows that country like a book.

The old Crescent property at Park City has been leased to Anell Johnson of Park City.

Wages of carmen at the Wabash mine has been reduced to \$2.75 from \$3 per shift of eight hours.

V. P. Strange, the well known mechanical engineer, has gone to Denver on a brief business trip.

The ore and bullion settlements reported last Saturday by McCormick & Co., showed settlements for the week aggregating \$61,139.

The opinion seems to prevail on brokers' rows that the directors of the New York Bonanza will have an assessment at tonight's meeting.

The death of W. P. A. H. Franklin will not interfere with the future plans of the Gold Development company, according to Mr. F. Murray, the resident manager.

A 2,000-ton lot of tailings is being hauled from the Daly-Judge mill in Park City for treatment at the zinc plant of the Western Ore Separating company in this city.

A telegram from the east conveys the information that Wm. H. Mucklow, president of the Majestic Copper company, has returned from the east. He is expected in Salt Lake soon.

A total of 2,750,000 pounds of ore was shipped from the Daly-West and Silver King mines of Park City last week. The former sent down 1,800,000 pounds, and the latter 1,450,000 pounds.

John Treweek, who has held the position of general manager of the Sunnyside mine in the Wm. H. Mucklow district for a number of months past, is down from the northern camp.

There are persistent rumors afloat, backed by mysterious reports at the mine and mill, to the effect that the Daly-Judge is about to start up and will little doubt that early next month this property will be in full blast again.—Park Record.

At the Harwood shaft is now down 130 feet, and is still in vein material. The vein is getting better as depth is attained. The vein seems to be leached out from some cause near the surface, and as depth is reached the values seem to be appearing. Sinking will continue down to the 500-foot mark, when a crosscut will be run to the foot wall and a drift run east and west on the vein from that point.—Park Record.

Manager Reed of the Naldiver is in camp Wednesday, and while here ordered operations at the mine discontinued for the time being. He instructed the employees to draw their pay for their time, however, as work will be resumed as soon as Foreman Quinn, whose home is now under quarantine on account of smallpox, is able to get out again.
