## IN THE STATE SUPREME COURT.

Four Candidates for the Industrial School—in the Islands Copper-Bell, Berrett Admitted to Practice.

The State Land Board is holding a selection today at which appraisers are being appointed for school lands in every county throughout the State; the list will be completed some time today and will be made public tomorrow.

## IN THE SUPREME COURT.

A Big Water Case Argued and Taken Under Assessment.

In the Supreme court today in the case of Harry Brown, appellant, vs. W. J. Stevens et al., it was argued by the court, after consideration by attorneys on both sides, that the cause be submitted to the jury.

The big water case of the North Point Crosscutting Irrigation company, respondent, vs. Utah and San Lake Canal company, Hugh Johnson, canal company, North Jordan, respondent, was argued today before Justice John H. Stevens, Justice Munn and Hon. M. L. Hinckley, associate justice, Justice Hinckley being disqualified to sit in the cause by reason of his having been a member of the lower court.

Being engaged in the Supreme court today, Judge Hinckley had no session in the equity division of the Third district court.

The judge in the suit of Green & Green vs. William Atwood, to recover \$100 damages sustained by reason of a horse allowing his team to run away and pull his sheep, disagreed and was discharged.

Clark Blamey has filed an answer in the suit brought by the State to recover \$100 damages sustained by reason of the county court's failure to pay the sheriff's fees.

Judge Hinckley has issued an order to the court, ordering Judge McMillay to file with the clerk of the Third district court the transfer on appeal in the case of The vs. Wm. Atwood, in which he has filed a motion to quash and disallow the appeal and that he be dismissed on the ground that he paid over the commissioners' fees to the sheriff.

The hearing of the case was adjourned until October 1st.

Before Judge Street.

In Judge Street's court today the suit of James Anderson vs. Gov. M. Scott et al. was argued and continued until next Sat. Oct. 11, 1896. The defendant, who is the attorney for the state, has filed a motion for a continuance for the term was past.

The suit of C. M. Jackson vs. Wm. Morgan et al. and the plaintiff was given time to file his answer in the extended complaint within five days.

Judgment was given this afternoon.

Anderson filed in the suit of Philip Bell et al. vs. Wm. H. Lyon et al. and findings ordered drawn.
