

Chinese Telegraphy. The Heraid's Hartford special: The Chinese government recently ent instructions through the embassy at Washington to the Chinese educational commission in this city, to establish a department of tele graphy, and operations will be com-menced next week. It is undertood that communication is solely in English or other tongues than Chinese, and that no system has yet been devised by which they can communicate by wire in their own In language. The project as reported here contemplates the establishment of a government telegraph system to extend to all of the empire, with operators who are to be thoroughly instructed alike in the theory and practical operation of the electric telegraph.
