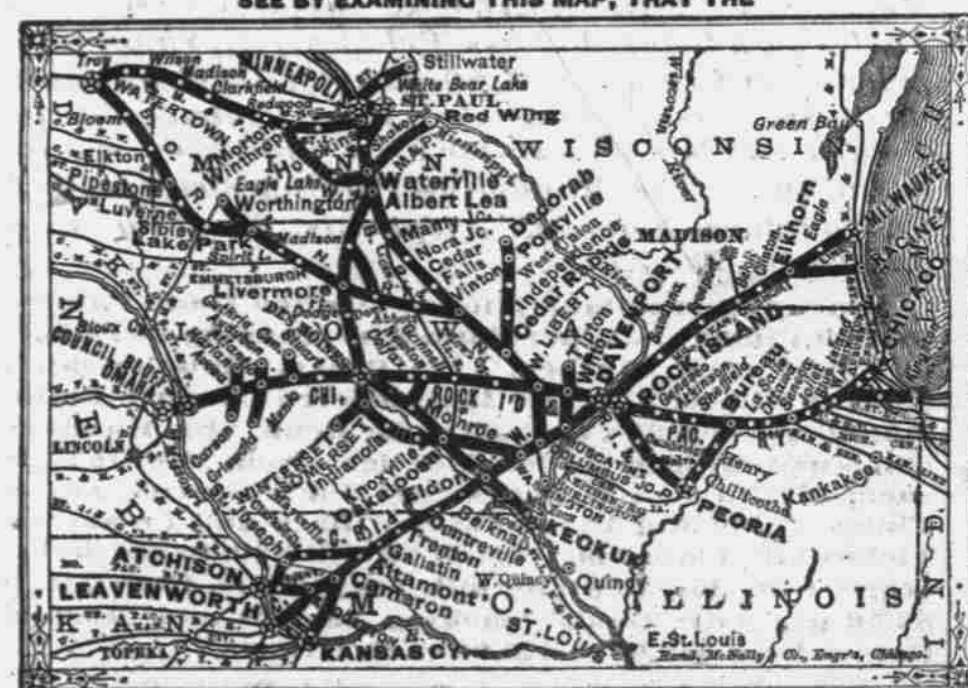

STEEL CARS.
A NEW INVENTION IN THE LINE OF
RAILWAY COACHES.

If the sanguine anticipations of cer-
tain gentlemen are realized, there is
to be a complete revolution in the
matter of car construction, and in-
stead of the present form of wooden
cars, both passenger and freight will
be transported in cylindrical cars made
of steel. For some months
there has been a course of con-
struction in East Boston a passenger
car of the new type, but from lack of
funds in the hands of the inventor, in-
terested in the invention, the progress
has been very slow. A few months
since gentlemen from the west came
to Boston to interest capitalists in the
construction of the Pacific and Great
Eastern Railroad. During this visit
he invited him to visit East Boston
and inspect the steel car building
works. He found the building
very close, and was so much im-
pressed by what he learned that he
looked up the inventor, and with true
western spirit, and is pushing forward
the completion of the car, which was
completed and put upon the rails in
H. and Chas. M. Smith of this city,
though many improvements are now
being incorporated. On Saturday
morning a visit was made to the shop
where the car is building. The frame
is complete and work upon the in-
terior has begun. It is proposed to
make the car the most magnificent
and complete in every detail. It is to
be a steel car, built of steel, and
therefore it is to be provided with every im-
provement and convenience for com-
fort and safety. It is to be a car with
toilet facilities adjoining; with com-
fortable chairs and lounges; with a
single pane of heavy glass. The cylin-
drical form of the car gives a very
wide appearance to the interior, al-
though it is really the same width as
Pullman cars.—Boston Herald.
