PEOPLE WANT FIVE CENT FARE

In Exchange for Street Railway Franchise—Will Enforce School Law.

Murray, Oct. 27.—The communication presented to the city council by Mrs. Birch, relating to damages alleged to have been done to her property on Second West by the city creating a levee was referred to the city attorney.

The report of the street committee recommending the acceptance of Boxelder street and Bamberger avenue was accepted after some discussion.

The franchise committee requested that a special meeting of the council be called for Oct. 24 at 8 p. m. to consider an ordinance which had been presented by the Utah Light and Railway company, asking for a franchise to construct and operate a street railway system in Murray city. The request was granted and a special meeting called for the above date.

In the special meeting called Wednesday night no conclusions were come to as to what privileges were to be given the Utah Light and Railway company, but it is certain that it will not get what it asked for. The people demand a five cent fare in exchange for extended franchise.

SCHOOL BUILDINGS UNINJURED.

The Murray school buildings suffered no damage from the recent severe storm, but on Monday last the principal

was obliged to call upon the girls of the eighth grade for teachers. On account of the cars being put out of commission seven of the teachers who reside in Salt Lake City failed to reach their fields of labor. The girls did good service as substitutes.

SCHOOL LAW TO BE ENFORCED.

On Thursday evening the board of education and the juvenile court commission held a conjoint session for the purpose of considering the compulsory clause of the school law, and also the duty of the juvenile court. It was decided to enforce the compulsory law, and require all children between the ages of eight and fifteen to attend school. The fact that children do not like to attend school is the best reason why they should be required to attend school. A child cannot be taught too early to observe law. In being taught to observe the rules of the home and the school, the child will be more apt to be a law-abiding citizen. While the juvenile court will extend mercy and patience to occasional delinquents, yet justice must be measured out to the habitual delinquent. The merchants are again warned and all others against hiring boys under 16 years of age unless they hold a proper certificate.

Should parents wish their children excused from school for valid reasons the matter must be presented to the superintendent of schools and a proper permit secured.

OLD TIME THEATRICAL MAN DEAD.

Undertaker C. H. Banks left this morning for Tooele to take charge of the funeral of W. C. Foster, a brother-in-law of Mr. Banks. The death of Mr. Foster occurred Thursday of general debility in his 74th year. He is well known to the old timers of Salt Lake, especially in theatrical circles, who will be interested to know of him. For many years he was copyist at the theater and was a member of the old stock company. The funeral was held today at 2 o'clock.

Havana, Oct. 27.—As a result of continued depredations by numerous small bands of ex-insurgents in Santa Clara province, Brig. Gen. Franklin Bell has ordered the Fifteenth cavalry, which is stationed at Pinaras, to occupy the towns of Santa Clara, Esperanza, Cienfuegos, Cruces and Santo Domingo, taking the places of the rural guard garrisons which will then be released to pursue and scatter the marauders. This pressing into service of the rural guards is in accordance with Gov. Maso's policy not to use American troops in the suppression of disorders.
