On Saturday last, December Sth, a large number of suits were insti-tuted in the Third District Court in this city, against Liberty E. Holden, who has held himself out the owner of all the stock, except a few shares, in what is known as the Old Telegraph Mining Court the Old Telegraph Mint is Anown as pany. The solutioneys for the plain-tiffs, being Judge Hiram A. John-son of New York; Hon. L. R. Critchfield and Judge J. W. Tyler of Cleveland, Ohio, and Measrs. Marshal & Royle of this city, have been engaged for some weeks in the preparation of these cases, which has been a very laborious work in consequence of the formation of new companies and indi-

tion of new companies and indi-vidual purchases of property by Holden, as claimed, into which the proceeds of the Old Telegraph Mine, amounting to \$1,000,000, as detima-ted, have been partially diverted. It seems from the pleadings and affidavits on file that Holden claimed in Fanuary, 1875, to own about one-fourth of the stock of the original company, organized under about one-fourth of the stock of the original company, organized under the laws of Michigan, though it is alleged that prior to that time he had not paid for his stock, and has never settled with the various com-panies of which he was managing director or agent, nor with the stockholders. To procure a settle-ment and ascertain whether Holden ever owned any stock is one object of the suits. of the suits.

At the date last named, certain persons living inCleveland and Tole-to, Ohio, and Detroit and Kalamazoo, Mich., claimed to own stock, amount ing to three-fourths of the whole. These persons and the Michigan companies, sometime in Novem-ber, 1874, had placed these mines in the hands of Holden, to manage and work the same, and it is claimed that during the following year he received as contributions and otherwise from the stockhol-dars and commanies shout \$40,000 ders and companies about \$40,000, and in addition took from the mines about \$30,000, but that dur-ing the same period he did not ex-pend over \$25,000 for the mines, and has never settled his accounts; that in Becember, 1875, having directed his tunnel towards the ladge then "being worked by the ledge then being worked by the Montreal company, which it is claimed Holden then knew all about, and which has since been adjudicated in the District Court as






