## BREVITIES.

New York is to have a "woman's parliament" next fall.

Fifty-five of the post offices of Texas are in charge of women.

A debating club for deaf mutes has been started in London.

The Oregon Enterprise says that state has 60,000 inhabitants.

Sticides have become epidemic in the Ohio penitentiary at Columbus. Three have occurred within a week.

The whole number of divorces in the State of Connecticut for 1888 was four hundred and sixty-eight.

A startling number of private residences are being destroyed through the South by the work of incendiaries.

One hundred and fifty women are regularly employed as maids and hotel carriers on the new opera house in Vienna.

A bachelor sea captain, who was remarking one day that he wanted a good chief officer, was promptly informed by a young lady that she had no objections to be his first mate. He took the hint and the lady.

On the occasion of a certain eclipse in Virginia, a colored individual became greatly excited. "Bress de Lord!" said he, "de nigger's time hab cum at last, and we's gwine to hab a black sun."

Prince Arthur, Duke of Edinburgh, second son of Queen Victoria, is now supposed to be at Honolulu, and, the Alta learns by private letter from the Islands, that there is talk of his visiting San Francisco, "in spite of the Fenians."

The Emperor of Russia, on hearing that the Austrian and Ottoman Ministers had been Prince Gortchakoff in order to effect the recall of Gen. Ignatieff, bluntly told the Prince that if any foreign ministers dared again to meddle with Russian representatives, they would receive their passports instantly.

They have introduced a new dodge at the Washington boarding-houses. They put half a dollar in the hash at breakfast, and the boarders eat hash then to the neglect of all other dishes, hoping to get the money. Hash has gone up ten per cent. in the market in consequence.

A musical competition, in which a hundred and fifty composers took part, was recently opened at Wurzburg, when the Duke Ernest of Saxe Coburg Gotha gained the third prize with a "Hymn to Peace," the words, in French, being by M. Gustave Oppelt. The piece was executed by 2,000 singers and 80 instruments.

"Don't lay in that posture, dear," said Mrs. Partington to Ike, who was stretched upon a sofa with his heels a foot higher than his head. "Don't lay so; raise yourself up and put this pillow under you. I once knew a young man who had the suggestion of the brain in consequence of laying so—his brains all run into his head; and with this admonition she left him to his nap."

A correspondent of the New York Observer says: "The king of Sweden is the most affable and approachable monarch in Europe. In his daily walks, or while going about in the public squares that ply through the waters of the city, as omnibuses do in New York, he enters freely into conversation with the people, and to strangers, especially Americans, he is exceedingly kind, or, as his subjects would say, gracious."

In Watertown, Wis., there is a boy 12 years old, who is 39 1/2 inches in height, and weighs only 18 pounds. When seven months old he was as large as children at that age ordinarily are, but from that time he ceased to grow, and has gained only two pounds in weight in over twelve years. He is not a perfectly formed child, having one club foot and no thumbs, but is bright and active.

England has a light house for every fourteen miles of coast, Scotland one for every thirty nine and one half miles, Ireland one for every thirty-four and one half miles, while France exhibits one for every 12.3 miles. The lighthouses in France are more than three times as numerous as in Scotland, and nearly three times as numerous as in Ireland.

The art of saying disagreeable things in a pretty way has been brought to perfection by French women. The other day two "dearest friends" were in conversation. "My dear," said the eldest, "do you know that your husband told me last night that your cheeks were like roses?" "Yes, love, I know he did. He spoke of it afterward, and said it was a pity they were yellow roses."

A little five year old boy was being instructed in morals by his mother. The old lady told him that all such terms as "By golly," "By jingo," "By thunder," etc., were only minced oaths, and but little better than any other profanity. In fact she said, he could tell a profane oath by the prefix of "by"—all such were oaths. "Well, then, mother," said the little hopeful, "there's a big oath in the newspapers—"By Telegraph." The old lady gave it up, and the boy is bewildered on morals.

Over 30,000 emigrants left Liverpool for America during the month of May. Of this number five-sixths intended to settle in the United States. It is estimated that this aggregate of new comers will be recorded for this and the following month at the great packet port of England. Not less than 40,000 Canadians will take-up their residence in this country in the same time. The sum total of emigration from all parts of the world to the United States for the present year will exceed half a million of persons.
