

coming more and more overcrowded every year, and that these are a poor class of sheep incapable of being moved as quickly as private flocks &c, for these and for many other reasons I would most respectfully submit to the court that in my judgment it would be unwise to undertake to herd them another winter. If kept at all they should be leased and proper bonds taken, as I advocated doing last season. There is, however, some risk even about this, and the grade of the sheep when this is done is continually going down,—there being no stimulus to parties leasing to improve the grade unless they had them leased for a period longer than one year, so that in my judgment they should be sold and the money invested in something certain to pay dividends.
