Short Line President and Party on a Visit to Salt Lake.

NO CHANGES IN RAILROAD MANAGEMENT

Utah and Pacific to Rapidly Increase Its Working Force and Also to Spend More Money.

Judge William D. Ormsby, president of the Short Line, has returned from the west. Accompanying him were the other two officers who were sent some days ago to join the party. Stephen Chase, then George W. Walker, and Judge W. T. Ormsby, with President Ormsby as his son, the last named continuing to be the general manager of the road. Mr. Walker is a son of Mr. Kelly, prominent citizen of St. Paul, Minn.

This morning President Ormsby was at the Hotel Utah, and he said he was very busy with the affairs of the road. He stated that he had nothing of any importance to do. His trip to San Francisco did not prevent him from attending to the management of the road. The purpose of his visit was to make a thorough inspection of the road. He said he would return in a few days and then go back to the business of the road except its general affairs, and would then return to the city.

For what he said he made no promises, but for the immediate future no changes are to be made. Still the early return of the three men would give the railroad more money to run on business principles. It will be the duty of those in control to keep the road in good condition, and to make a thorough inspection of the road. The road is in good condition, and this will be done.

President Ormsby will be a very busy man during his stay in the city.
