RUNAWAY MIXUP AND FIRE ALARM.

Boy and Bicycle Run Into by Fire Chief Graves—Wheel Was Smashed.

DEMISE OF WILLIAM SLATER.

Chris Peterson Out on Bail—Coffin, his Victim, Recovered—Merit System At State Industrial School.

Chris Peterson, the young man of Huntsville who was arrested about two weeks ago on the charge of assault with intent to commit murder, by stabbing John Coffin with a pocket knife in the brain, was released on bail Saturday evening in the sum of \$1,000, which amount was fixed at his arraignment. Peterson has practically recovered from the severe beating received at the hands of Coffin after he had stabbed him. He will for some months to come carry scars on his face as a result of the conflict.

Coffin, the young man who was so seriously stabbed, and whose death was thought sure, has also sufficiently recovered from his injuries as to be out on the street again. The wound in his head has healed up in remarkably quick time.

Just when the case against Peterson will come up for trial has not been decided, but it is expected that he will be called for preliminary hearing in the very near future as both parties concerned principally in the case have now sufficiently recovered to be able to appear in court.

DEATH OF WILLIAM SLATER.

William Slater, an old time resident of Ogden, having come here in the seventies, died last evening at the family residence, 205 Adams avenue, of general debility. The deceased was born in Lancashire, England, November 21, 1832. He joined the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in his native land and was faithful to his religious convictions to the last. He leaves an aged wife to survive him. The time of funeral has not been arranged.

DISASTROUS RUNAWAY.

A runaway team Saturday evening brought out the Ogden fire department and caused considerable excitement in other ways. The team belonged to a Mr. Read and got started by another horse running into it. They ran on Washington avenue across the Ogden river bridge and ran into a street car pole in front of the Riverside mills, on which was located a fire alarm box. They knocked the box down and left a good part of the wagon. The destruction of the box sent in the alarm and called out the department. The team went on down Seventeenth street until

PRESSES FOR EXPORT.

The Western Newspaper Union makes shipment of Printing Outfit to far off Tahiti.

The Western Newspaper Union of this city last week completed the sale and shipment of a printing outfit to the Society Islands Missionary association of the Latter-day Saints. The shipment included one of the justly celebrated Clarendon presses and an advance paper cutter made by the same manufacturer. The consignment was made to Elder Ed. S. Hill, who is situated at Papeete, Tahiti, the largest and most important of the Society Islands group. The outfit is to be used in printing tracts to assist in disseminating the religion of the Latter-day Saints to the native natives of these islands.

The Western Newspaper Union is one of the largest and most substantial jobbing houses in the United States, and the growth of their business since their establishment in Salt Lake has been phenomenal. Last year their new building, 125 West Temple street, was completed and the time it was thought large enough to answer their purpose for a number of years to come but their manager advises us that they are already cramped for room. They are at present considering the advisability of putting in a stock of both coarse and fancy papers and the spring at which time they will probably install their own power and light plant.
