WATERLOO AND SUGAR HOUSE ADDITION TO BE ANNEXED IN NEAR FUTURE.

Plan Being Devised to Make Territory Annexed Uniform in Shape—Flood Claim Allowed.

Within the next few weeks, Waterloo, Sugar House ward, and two or more nearby additions will be annexed to Salt Lake City.

The members of the committee of municipal laws and the engineering committee met Thursday night and it was decided to extend the limits of the city to take in these additions.

The petition of the Waterloo residents was adopted and sent to the city attorney to draw up an annexation ordinance. Several of the streets in the Waterloo addition bear the same names as some streets in Salt Lake.

In order not to confuse the residents, the city engineer has been notified to change the names of the streets. He will ask for suggestions from the residents in the addition.

The district includes Tempest avenue to Twelfth South street and from Third East to Fifth East streets.

The Sugar House petition was laid over for a week in order to develop a plan whereby other property can be annexed making the city boundary along Twelfth South street from Third East to Thirteenth East streets.

Instead of having the ragged boundary which this section would create, it is believed that the property owners in this section will petition the council to be admitted to the city.

The claims committee recommended the payment of the claim filed by Mrs. P. Lynn for damages to her property from food waters.

The committee on improvements decided not to lease any more gravel pits on the city's property. It is declared that the gravel pits make the sidewalk unsightly and in a few years that part of the city will be built up.

A meeting of the improvement committee will be held at 2 o'clock this afternoon at the Wilson hotel to consider petitions from different parts of the city where lights are asked for.

The committee will take a trip over the city to find out where lights are needed.
