LOCAL BRIEFS.

Deputy Marshal R. E. Heywood has gone to Vernal to serve subpoenas there for jurors and witnesses.

Miss Jennie S. Stanger gave an entertaining dramatic reading last evening, in the East Side Baptist church, assisted by Mrs. V. B. Cutler as singer.

Elders Wm. M. Stewart and Mathew Thomsen will address the Saints of the Twelfth ward tomorrow night, the meeting beginning at 6:30. The public is invited.

James Anderson, a Eureka miner, filed a petition in bankruptcy yesterday afternoon, with liabilities amounting to \$159.45, and assets amounting to \$23.75, all of which is exempt.

Landford G. S. Holmes of the Knutsford is in receipt of an unusually fine colored photograph of his youngest son Dwight, who is a student at Phillips Academy, Exeter, N. H., where he is trying to make up his mind whether to go to Yale or to Harvard.

State Supt. of Schools Nelson went to Heber City today to attend the Wasatch county teachers' institute. He delivered an address to the teachers this morning, and will address a public meeting of citizens at night.

A special effort is being made to pay the \$5,000 mortgage which has for a number of years been hanging over the Episcopal church, and pledge cards are being sent around by a special committee to the members of the church, and collection in the parish.

The many friends of Mr. and Mrs. William H. Lind will sympathize with them in the loss of their 8-month-old son, Ruon Sylvester, who passed away last night at the family residence, 463 Pearl avenue, of pneumonia. The funeral will be held at 11:30 a. m. tomorrow.

Petitions in bankruptcy were filed Thursday afternoon, with the clerk of the U. S. court by Thomas C. Edgar, a laborer, with liabilities at \$562.30, and assets at \$260.60, of which \$99.50 is exempt; also by Albert B. Riches, a laborer, with liabilities at \$1,124.93, and assets at \$38.75.

The Putnam memorial fund of St. Mark's cathedral was started Nov. 1, 1900, and now amounts to \$121.90. It has grown at the rate of about \$25 a year, and been made up mainly of offerings given at the feast of All Saints. It is proposed to accumulate the fund to \$500, and then get a pulpit in memory of the late Rev. N. F. Putnam, once the much beloved rector and parish priest of St. Mark's.

The executive board of the state union of Christian Endeavor will hold a meeting this evening, at the residence of the secretary, Miss Eva M. Fleming, 225 Second East street, to discuss the organizing of senior and junior C. E. societies over the state, as well as ways and means of advancing the general interests of the work in Utah; also, the quarter century memorial fund.

In view of a morning paper claiming that no improvements of note had been made in the Salt Lake postoffice within the last few years, it was remarked at the postoffice this evening, at the residence of the present postoffice administration 21 stations had been opened about the city, including the East Side postoffice, 23 carriers had been added to the list, two collectors, moreover, the general delivery window and registry office were now open until 9 p. m., whereas they formerly closed at 6; and registered mail now goes through Ogdens without relaying, thus saving 15 hours.
