

SUCCESS WITH CLOVERS.  
See Close Head and Pictures of At vs Good  
and Well Prepared.

The first requisite of success is good seed, by which we mean not only seed that has full germinating power, but that is free from dirt and has not already passed its limit on the farm.

The second condition of success is to get the seed on the right kind of land, properly prepared. On the right kind of land, "says the Iowa Husbandman, we mean land that is not subject to flooding in ordinary years or grassy slopes, and by "properly prepared" we mean to be ready for the tools that the season may bring. For example, you would not think of sowing clover on the hillsides and sheltering it in the shade. It thrives well in the sun, but it cannot grow in the shade where the weeds grow. In fact, if you sow your legumes on the hillsides, in the most of cases, as far as the sun goes, the weeds will easily get a start and the grass will not be able to compete. The result will be that the grass is as early as the weeds.

The third requisite of success is to get enough seed the proper depth in the ground at the right time of the year. Many a farmer fails to get a good stand because he does not plant enough or播得 too late. This causes great difficulties. New beginners should not sow less than 15 pounds of seed per acre, and 15 pounds may have been too little. The right time of the year is as early as you can get it. The last way to succeed is to fallow, as soon as the spring, and then follow the plowing and tilling of the ground to cover it. It grows with spring rains, it should be sown with the rains, and the right soil has the same depth of covering that is given to the grass. The culture in this has more the effect of a man than of a woman, so it requires closer care on the part of the farmer than almost any other. Where the seeds are heavy, and especially when they are a little too wet at the time of sowing, this would be too deep covering, and it is better to cultivate the growing grass and then sow the clover seed and follow with the harrow.

We have all the above laid down in the sowing of clover with a good kind of grass as a success crop. The only percentage in sowing clover with small grass is that it enables the farmer to reap a crop, or, more properly speaking, about the starting of a crop.
