Correspondence.

SALT LAKE CITY, Feb. 2, 1868.

Editor Deseret News:—The personal of your leader in last Tuesday's issue upon "Astrology and its Evils" caused me no small gratification, as the practice of running after astrologers and soothsayers, so prevalent in our midst, cannot, I am persuaded, be too highly deprecated.

We are nowhere informed either in ancient or modern revelation that the Lord ever appointed astrologers or soothsayers to guide, direct or perfect His people; but we are informed that the Priesthood—consisting of apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers &c.—is the medium he has ordained for this purpose. Now, as the Latter-day Saints are the only people who claim to be guided by such an organization it is highly inconsistent for any person claiming that title to run after such persons. Yet there are many among us who, the moment any perplexity arises, or before starting any new enterprise, will run for counsel to an astrologer, soothsayer, diviner by cards or something equally as ridiculous and absurd. Such a course is highly reprehensible. It weakens faith in the Priesthood,—appointed and acknowledged by the Lord, and engenders a faith in principles which, if founded in truth at all, have never, that we know of, been acknowledged by Him, at least, for the ends they are now made to subserve.

The affairs of the Church and people individually and collectively, through all their persecutions and wanderings have been guided to their present position of independence and peace by the Priesthood, without the least assistance from astrologers or astrology; then surely the same power is adequate to give the counsel that is sought from astrologers,—which is seldom of a more important nature than to aid in the search for a lost "critter," or to satisfy the curiosity of some jealous husband, lover, sweetheart or wife.

If astrology be of heavenly origin, it will, when necessary for the guidance of His cause and people, most certainly be made known to the Saints through the proper channel; till then let all faithful Saints look to the source they have found all sufficient in every emergency hitherto, resting assured that they and the cause they have espoused can be led safely and triumphantly through all dangers without the aid of either moonshine or starlight.
