SUMS OF MONEY TO LOAN.

REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.
The Evening Session Pays a Tribute
of Respect to Heroes
of the Past.
And Finally Disposes of the Vir-
ginia Contest with a Sig-
nificant Vote.

There Will be No Material Change
in the Situation Until
Tomorrow.
Mrs. Parsons Arrested for Ad-
vertising Parson's Book
on Anarchism.
A Report from the Dark Continent
Discredits Henry M. Stanley's

THE CONVENTION.
The Evening Session Disposes of
the Virginia Contest.

Chicago, June 20.—Some expecta-
tion was indulged in by many of those
who came to Salt Lake this evening that
a ballot might be taken before ad-
journment; but no one who under-
stood the situation had any idea that
the proceedings would go so far, as
among the gentlemen in the hall, and
the work disposed of and the plat-
form adopted before adjournment.

CALL TO ORDER.
The audience was uncomfortably
crowded and the atmosphere in the
hall was stifling. The fluttering of
thousands of fans did not have the
effect of causing a breath of air to
pass. The secretary read a telegram
received from the republican central
committee of California, sending greet-
ings to the convention and returning
gratitude for the support given to the
Pacific Coast by the election of
Estes as permanent chairman.

Since announced that as the limit of
time for speaking was five minutes
the speakers would be called
according to the order of the pro-
gram. The first speaker was
presentation of candidates for the Presi-
dency and as would the convention be
called to order on time.

SYMPATHY TO GERMANY.
Wellington (N.J.) offered the fol-
lowing:
Resolved, That we tender on behalf of
the republican party of the United States
the warmest sympathy in this hour of
national crisis to the people of Ger-
many, who are struggling for liberty
and independence against the
tyranny of a despotic ruler.

RESOLUTIONS OF RESPECT
to the memory of Great Statesmen,
President Arthur and the late Senator
Crittenden, which were also adopted by
a rising vote.

PROCEEDED TO KILL TIME
by announcing the telegrams received
for the delegates, after which the band
in the gallery proceeded to put in the
time until the credentials committee
would be ready to report. While the
band was playing, Colonel Fred Grant
and his wife, accompanied by Mr.
Potter Palmer, entered the convention
and walking through one of the dele-
gation aisles, stopped at the platform
and took seats in the rear of the
stand assigned to them. The conven-
tion cheered the visitors, and again
received no response.

He then called upon the committee
on resolutions, but Harry of North
Carolina stated the committee was
not ready to report, and would not be
ready to report.

Bayne then suggested that the roll of
states should be called for the purpose
of selecting members of the execu-
tive committee, but its adoption was
deferred.

Then the convention, having nothing
else to do, commenced to
call upon Bradley,
and in response to the call, the chair-
man presented W. O. Bradley of Ken-
tucky.

After thanking the convention for the
honor conferred upon him, he re-
quested that he should address the
convention, he said the republicans
were here to accept the challenge
of the nation.

St. Louis of Kansas, said the most
enthusiastic outburst of applause had
yet been seen in the convention,
moved Governor Foraker of Ohio,
the motion to address the convention.

The motion was agreed to and
Governor Foraker
was introduced and received with a
revel of cheers. While he thanked the
convention for the honor conferred upon
him, he said he would have greatly
preferred to have been called upon
before.

The question had been asked what
are we here for? [Laughter.] The
republicans were here to formulate
republican principles. They were
here to nominate the next President of
the United States. The first was easy
to do, but the second was not so easy.
