SUING McKIBBIN.

A \$200,000 lawsuit for Cullen Park & Retirement.

On June 22, 1908, an American woman was created in railroad circles here today when it became known that she had been granted by the United States Pacific against C. H. McKibbin, late general purchasing agent of the road for the recovery of \$200,000, which he is said to have defrauded the company. The suit was filed last Saturday night, but the suit was not made public until today.

In January, 1907, McKibbin became purchasing agent of the company. The petition alleges that as soon as McKibbin was appointed and accepted of the position he immediately set to work to defraud the company.

The suit is brought on a contract with C. H. Burns & Co., lumber dealers of St. Louis, and the petition charges that McKibbin, in violation of the contract, sold to Burns & Co. lumber which he had purchased from the company.

When McKibbin was appointed purchasing agent of the company, he was given a contract with Burns & Co. for the purchase of lumber. The contract provided that McKibbin was to purchase lumber for Burns & Co. at a price not to exceed the price of the lumber as purchased by the company.

McKibbin is alleged to have purchased lumber from the company at a price of \$100,000, which he then sold to Burns & Co. at a price of \$200,000.

The suit is brought on a contract with Cullen Park & Retirement. The contract provided that McKibbin was to purchase lumber for Cullen Park & Retirement at a price not to exceed the price of the lumber as purchased by the company.
