### SMELTER FOR GOLDFIELD.

### Col. Posey Says 1.000-Ton Plant Will Be Built.

Col. O. P. Posey, who is known in Salt Lake as the organizer of the Bingham Consolidated, has announced that defin-ite arrangements have been concluded ite arrangements have been concluded for the building of a 1,000-ton smelter at Goldfield by the Nevada Copper Smelting and Mining company, of which he is president. Other officers are W. E. Mitchell, vice-president, and W. M. Hoagland, a rich New Yorker, secretary and treamer. The corpora-tion, Col. Posey states, has immediate call on \$5,000,000 to further its opera-tions. tions

From Goldfield the Bingham smelter gets 150 tons dally of the silicious Goldfield ores to mix wit hthe sulphide out-put of Bingham. To provide a suitable flux for the Goldfield ores, to be treathux for the Goldneid ores, to be treat-ed by the new smelter, Col. Posep has bought the Thanksgiving group of seven claims, three miles east of Lida, Nev., upon which is an immense body of low-grade iron-copper sulphides, desirable for a smelting mait for the Goldfield product. Goldfield rejoices at the news, which means annual millions to be saved in freight.

# CORAM WINS OUT.
