New York, Oct 7 .- Efforts of counsel for five insurance officials, indicated as the result of the legislative insurance investigation, to secure further delay of their cases, met with opposition on the part of Dist. Atty. Jerome in the criminal branch of the supreme court today. The officials under indictof the Metropolitan Life Insurance company: George W. Perkins and Charles S. Fairchild, formerly of the New York Late, and Waiter R. Gillette and Ronort A. Grannis, ex-vice presidents of the Muthal Life.

Motions were made by attorneys for the defendants asking that the indictments against their clients be diamissed. They stated, however, that they were not prepared to argue such motions and asked that a further delay of two or three weeks be granted in which to prepare their cases.

Mr. Jerome insisted that the indictons should be argued by next Monday. He said that the attorneys had had from three to four promits in which to prepare their arguments and every consideration had been extended them.
