Many Unlisted Species. New York, Des. 12.-Dr. W. T. Hornaday, director of the Broux park zoo, has returned from a two months' trip in Mexico, where he went to study the mountain sheep of that country. He is more than ever convinced that there are many unlisted species of sheep to be found in Mexican mountain ranges. One sheep he shot measured 36 inches high at the shoulder and weighed 300 pounds, which Dr. Hornaday says is the largest mountain sheep he has ever heard of.
