"That if any male person in a Territory or other As exclusive jurisdic-Mal, mercarter cohabits with more than one woman, he shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor, and on conviction thereof, shall be puulshed by a fine of not more than three, hundred dollars, or by imprisonment of not more than six months, or by both said punishments, in the discretion of the court.
