Elisworth, was invited to come aboard as his (the capitaln's) guest. Mr. Elisworth responded to the invitation, but when half way up the gang plank was stopped by Colombian soldiers and turned back.

The Colombian authorities would not permit the Trent to take any passen-gers, mail or cargo from Colombian ports for Colon. Consul Ellsworth told the people on

the Trent that he had been repeatedly rulted by the Colombian officials since the recognition of the independence of Panama by the United States.
